
TWO PROMISING UVI STUDENTS RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIPS FROM DENMARK TO STUDY THERE

On the occasion of the commemoration of the Transfer Centennial in Christiansted last year, we learned from the Danish Prime Minister Lars Løkke Rasmussen that as a conciliatory gesture for the injustices inflicted on the ancestors of our citizens the Danish Government would provide scholarships for island students to study in Denmark.

We are happy to announce that two current students at St. Croix's Albert A. Sheen Campus of the University of the Virgin Islands have selected to avail themselves of that opportunity starting this fall semester. Their names are Marc-Anthony Colon and Tione Grant, and the scholarships are at the University of Aalborg, Denmark's city of Esbjerg campus. Their fields of study are highly technical and impressive. Both will take Chemistry classes in Denmark; Tione to eventually pursue a career in chemical engineering; Marc-Anthony is aeronautical engineering. We wish them all the best and will hear from them on their return in January.
